

KLONDIKE PIZZA EMPLOYEE DRESS CODE

Klondike Pizza® Inc. and its owners and managers reserve the right to determine what dress and grooming, i.e. cosmetics, hair, general grooming, etc. is acceptable and meets our standards as befitting a wholesome, family restaurant atmosphere. There will be no deviations from this code.

TATTOOS/ Brands, imbeddings, or other unnatural body markings, etc., Tattoos are allowed as long as they are not offensive (nudity, foul language, gang-related, racist, hateful). Please remember, Klondike Pizza is a family restaurant.

BODY PIERCINGS: Are not to be visible at any time. NO TONGUE, NOSE, EYEBROW, LIP, EAR PLUGS (see jewelry), etc. Coming to work with any of these piercings is grounds for immediate termination. Please remove prior to working your shift.

SHIRT: A clean Klondike shirt. It may be worn outside or tucked in. If you wear an undershirt, it must be white. No long sleeves.

PANTS: Khaki-colored pants or dark jeans. No jeans that are faded or shredded or have holes. No “cargo” style pants. No Leggings/Jeggings. Pants must be clean and unwrinkled. Pants must fit well. No baggy, saggy or too tight pants. No tears, no holes, no worn-out looking pants, no frayed hems. Pants are to be worn at the waist. No Low-Rise pants. Underwear is never to show. Khaki shorts may be worn with the same criteria as pants and are to be no shorter than 2 inches above the knee. No “cargo” style shorts. No chains. NO SAGGING.

BELT: If shirt is worn tucked in, a belt must be worn. Plain style - black, tan, brown.

SHOES: Must be clean, sturdy, enclosed, laced, rubber soled, leather. For your safety and comfort, do not wear slip-ons, sandals, canvas style or boots.

SOCKS: Clean, solid color socks are to be worn at all times. White, Black, Brown, Navy, Beige.

UNDERGARMENTS: Appropriate undergarments must be worn at all times. For women this includes a brassiere that properly conceals and supports.

APRON: A clean apron is to be worn at all times. The only exception is if you are working the oven and are too hot.

JEWELRY: No necklaces, pins, bracelets or anklets. **Earrings:** Hoop Style: no bigger than a quarter in diameter. Color: Gold, Silver, bronze or Pewter. Studs: Gold, Silver, Bronze, Pewter or Gemstone. If you have a second or third piercing in your ear, you may wear a small stud. Four or more piercings are not to be worn.

EAR PLUGS: May not be bigger than 00 Gauge. Plugs must be solid—no “see-through.” Color may be Gold, Bronze, Silver, Pewter, Black or a Flesh tone that matches your skin color. No other colors are acceptable. Plugs must be plain in style and may not have any ornamental embellishments.

NAME TAGS: Are to be worn at all times. Do not wear someone else’s tag or put a phony name in your tag unless approved by management.

HAIR: No extreme styles, i.e.: mohawk, spiked. Hair must be clean and neatly trimmed. Bangs must not hang into eyes. Long hair must be secured in a ponytail. If your ponytail hangs below neck it must be braided. No loose hair around face or neck - clip it back.

HAIR IN THE KITCHEN: Unless your hair is very short, hair must be clipped back and (if long enough) secured in a ponytail. Longer hair must be tightly secured in a braided ponytail. No “wispy” or loose hair around the face. If we determine your hair is too messy, and you cannot secure it properly, we will provide a hairnet.

FACE: Men’s faces must be freshly shaved. If you have a beard, it must be closely trimmed and the rest of the face and neck shaved. If you are considering growing a beard, goatee or mustache, talk to your manager first. We understand that some men have very sensitive skin and shaving can be painful—however, our employees must adhere to this code.

MAKEUP: Must be subtle and natural looking. No black, brown, purple, white etc. lipstick. No heavy dark lines around lips or eyes. No bright eye colors.

COLOGNE: Keep it very light! Many people are allergic to perfumes.

HANDS/Nails: Hands must be clean at all times. Nails must be short. No dirt under nails. Hangnails neatly trimmed. No dirty bandages.

California Law does not allow restaurant workers to wear any nail polish, gels or acrylics.
